

Scripture for next Sunday (1st Sunday of Lent)

Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7 The Lord God planted a garden in Eden.

Romans 5:12-19 In Adam all die. In Christ all live.

Matthew 4:1-11 Jesus fasted forty days and forty nights.

The serpent tempts Eve and Adam in the garden of Eden. The devil tempts Jesus in the desert. Though Adam and Eve are talked into disobeying God, Jesus resists the devil's repeated attempts. St. Paul related the two and explains that the effects of Jesus' obedience to God's will—from the desert to the cross—far exceed the harmful effect of Adam's disobedience. Let us listen next Sunday to these stories of temptation.

PALMS: If you have your blessed palms from last year, please bring them in to the commons <u>NLT 2 p.m. this</u> Monday, Feb. 24. We'll burn and use on Ash Wednesday.



Ash Wednesday is February 26 — LENT BEGINS! Masses on Ash Wednesday will be at 12:15 & 7 p.m.

Ash Wednesday (and Good Friday April 10) are days of fast and abstinence. ALL the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting is to be observed by those 18+ who have not yet turned 59. On a fast day 1 full meal is allowed. Two other meals (sufficient to maintain strength) should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, liquids including milk and juices are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, <u>no meat is allowed</u>. (When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)



Lent is almost upon us. It begins this coming week. This is that time when we are deciding exactly what we are going to do for Lent, and what we are going to give up for Lent. I encourage everyone to take this to prayer. It is so easy to say I am going to give up desserts for Lent. It is especially easy to say that when we want to loose weight. That may seem like a good idea, but there is a better way to benefit from fasting in Lent.

The first reading this weekend invites us all to be holy. It invites us to be like God. The reason I invite people to pray about their Lenten sacrifices is so that God can lead us to what will make us truly holy. What can we all give up that will remove some of the noise from our life? What can we give up that can bring us closer to God? What can we do this Lent that will truly make us holy?

In addition to the sacrifices we make for Lent, it can also be a time for us to add something to our lives. There are many things we can add to our lives that will also help us to become holy. The simplest thing we can add is prayer. I hope that is something that is already a part of everyone's daily life, but we can always add more. We can take some extra time for ourselves to just spend in God's presence.

We can also find more ways to pray together as a community. We will be offering the Stations of the Cross every Friday evening here at the church. This is a great way to spend some time reflecting on the Passion of our Lord and exactly how our lives have been changed by this. We can also spend some extra time going to Mass. For anyone who does not regularly attend daily Mass, consider going at least once a week. I continue to keep both morning and evening Masses on our daily calendar so as many people as possible will have the opportunity to attend at least once during the week.

There are many other things we can do as well. There are ways to get more involved in ministry or in service to the community. Whatever you choose, I pray that this Lent will be an opportunity for everyone to grow closer to the Lord and become more holy.

CYBER SAFETY/SECURITY Event Thursday, Feb. 27, 6:30 p.m. in the Great Room

Everyone is invited to attend. Special Agent Travis Howard with the Virginia State Police High Crimes Unit will give a highly informative Cyber Security presentation for parents, guardians, teachers, and other caregivers this Thursday evening, Feb. 27 at 6:30 p.m. in the Great Room. His presentation will focus on current internet trends and apps used by children and the potential risks and red flags to look out for. Special Agent Howard will also provide advice as to how to implement parental controls to protect children on the Internet. There will be a simultaneous presentation for students (Grades 5-8) by a Virginia Rules Instructor entitled "Technology and You" which will focus on improving students' understanding of some of the difficulties posed by technology, including the hazards of the Internet and dangers and consequences of sexting and cyber-bullying. This separate program, implemented by the Office of the Attorney General, is specifically geared towards middle and high school students. There will also be crafts and/or activity for younger children during the presentation.
