# **Scripture for next Sunday** (18th Sunday/Ordinary Time)

Isaiah 55:1-3

Come to the Lord.

Psalm 145

"The hand of the Lord feeds us; He answers all our needs."

Matthew 14:13-21

*The people ate and were satisfied.* 

"The hand of the Lord feeds us," we sing in next Sunday's responsorial psalm, and the readings next Sunday attest to this proclamation. In Isaiah, the LORD invites everyone to share in food and drink. In the Gospel, Jesus invites the crowds to stay and feeds thousands with five loaves and two fish. Neither hunger nor thirst, poverty nor want, famine nor distress can separate us from the love and generosity of the Lord. Let us listen to God's word knowing that we are invited to the feast as well.



I am drawing on my homilies from last week and this week as I reflect on everything happening in the world right now. There is so much unknown right now. It seems that everything we know about this pandemic is constantly changing. It seems that we still do not know what we do not know. Not knowing brings anxiety, but it does not have to.

I remember well the day I sat in on a conference call with all priests in the diocese listening to the bishop announce that all public Masses were suspended until further notice. It is something I thought I would never hear. As surprising at that was, there was something that still felt somewhat familiar to me. It reminded me of my days in emergency services sitting through a briefing planning for a major event or a disaster. I have enough experience dealing with emergencies that I felt ready to deal with this crisis.

I have been learning that I was not nearly as ready for this as I thought I was. This has been so different than anything I have ever experienced. This has not been a crisis that we experience, then recover, and then move on. This has not ended. There is no indication that this will end anytime soon. I think many things are going to change for us forever. I do not know to what extent this will happen. I do not know how long we are going to have to be comfortable with wearing masks everywhere we go.

So where am I going with all this? This is a difficult time and it is going to be difficult for a long time. Many people are and will continue to struggle with everything that has changed for us. How can we deal with this? Our response to this must start with our faith. We have to remember that we have a God with a wisdom so far beyond our understanding. Even as we face a very unknown future, we need to trust in God's plan. We do not need to have the answers for every question we face. God has the answers. He is the answer.

Know that I continue to pray for this community and everyone who is struggling right now. Please pray for me.
