REMINDERS: Everyone (age 10+) must bring/wear a face mask; ALL Receiving Communion must wear a face mask (even if younger than age 10). For Weekend Masses, the only entrance will be the double doors at main p/lot. Please arrive 20-30 minutes prior to Mass time. Door unlocked approx. 45 min. before Mass time. We have a reduced capacity due to social distancing mandate, if capacity is met, we'll not be able to allow anyone else into the building; however at this time we have had no issue getting everyone seated. —Once Mass begins (and we begin on time!), the door is locked and no one else can enter.

Per CDC guidelines/Diocesan restrictions those in a vulnerable categories encouraged to please stay home— Older adults (65+); those with immunocompromised health; those with serious health issues; those in house-hold with a vulnerable person. **ANY ONE FEELING ILL should not attend.**

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass is still in effect until further notice.

I have to say thank you to everyone at Saint Anne's who has done so much to continue supporting us. We were able to upgrade our livestream setup exactly how we wanted and we are in the process of installing everything. If we do not have it all on line by this weekend, we will have it by next weekend. This is going to help us continue to reach out to people who cannot come to Mass in person. I have been told that we must pass on to everyone when the Masses will be live streamed. Every daily Mass Tuesday-Friday will be live streamed. Saturday evening Mass at 5:30 will be live streamed, but it will not be saved. After the Mass it will be gone. Sunday morning at 8:30 will be live streamed and saved so it can be watched later. Only the Sunday morning Mass at 11:30 will not be streamed or recorded. Anyone who does not want to take the chance of appearing on a live stream should come to that Mass.

In the process of learning to do all this, I am learning so much more about digital video and audio. I am looking forward to adding some of this new knowledge to my YouTube videos. There is so much more I can do, and having two seminarians with me for the summer will only make it better.

Something else I have learned, or maybe relearned during this time is that there is always a way. When we are following Christ and doing his work, there is always a way to make it happen. It may not be the way we wanted it to happen, or what we thought should happen, but there is a way to accomplish what He sent us to do. Sometimes we have to get creative. Sometimes our methods are less than ideal, but they still work. His work is still being done.

We are continuing to move forward with Virginia as we slowly ease restrictions. We are soon going to be considering ways to bring back some of our ministries like book club, Bible study, and RCIA. Attendance at weekend Mass continues to grow. It has been so good to see people in the pews again during Mass. I am looking forward to seeing more of you in the future.

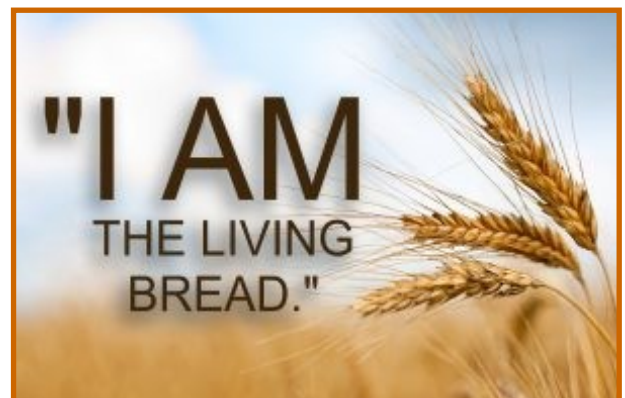
PRAYER for SPIRITUAL COMMUNION
