Public celebration of the Mass

weekends: **Saturdays at 5:30 p.m.**
Sundays at 8:30 a.m. & 11:30 a.m.

Please review the **guidelines** listed on the next page of this bulletin (also posted at the link on our parish webpage).

Everyone attending (age 10+) must bring and wear a face mask — and ALL THOSE receiving Communion must wear a face mask (even if younger than age 10).

One entrance only: for Weekend Masses, the only entrance will be the double doors at main parking lot. Please arrive 30 minutes prior to Mass time. We will unlock and begin screening approx. 45 min. before Mass begins.

We have a reduced capacity due to the restrictions and social distancing mandate, so if capacity is met, we will not be able to allow anyone else into the building.

Also, once Mass begins (and we do plan to begin on time!), we will lock the entrance and not allow anyone else to enter... so please do not arrive late as we cannot let you in once Mass has begun.



How is everyone doing? This is a question I have wanted to ask for a while. It will be the subject of some upcoming videos as well. It occurred to me that I am able to reach out to our community through these letters and my videos, but I know very little about how everyone else is doing. Lately, it seems I only get updates from people in our community when the news is bad. There is plenty of bad news out there. People are starting to break down amid this current crisis. **PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF THE MASS
GUIDELINES/RESTRICTIONS (as of 05/29/2020)**

- Please arrive 30+ minutes prior to liturgy so everyone can be admitted and seated; exterior door will not be unlocked until our scheduled volunteer ushers are in place (will unlock approx. 45 min. prior to Mass time).
- The **ONLY ENTRANCE for weekend Masses:** double doors at main parking lot, near the Great Room.
- Social distancing is to be maintained outside in parking lot and as you line up to enter the building, and inside. (note: *family/households need not social distance*).
- All attending the liturgy (**age 10 and older**) **must wear face coverings** (*bring your own face covering*). And **EVERYONE receiving Communion** must wear face covering (even those under age 10).
- Prior to entering you will be asked: if you've had a fever in past 2 weeks; if you or anyone in house-hold has a new cough/new shortness of breath; if you've come in contact with anyone positive for COVID19.
— if yes, you will not be permitted to enter.
- We are limited to 50% capacity of the building with allowing for social distancing in seating. **Once that is met, we can't allow any more folks to enter.**
- **Once Mass begins**, entrance will be locked and we won't be admitting anyone else into the building.
- After you enter the building, an usher will escort you thru the commons and into the sanctuary for seating.
 - ⇒ There will be different sections for seating of individuals, couples, family/households.
 - ⇒ We ask for your understanding that you will not be able to “choose” your seat for liturgy; you will be seated by the usher based on the criteria set forth for seating as people enter the space.
- ♦ We cannot have worship aids or hymnals in the space.
- ♦ We cannot pass the collection baskets at the offertory; basket(s) will be available as you enter & as you leave for you to place your donations/contributions.
- ♦ Choirs are suspended; the assembly is asked not to sing—in light of scientific data that singing can increase the spread of the virus.
- ♦ Refrain from holding hands during the Our Father and we will not shake hands at the sign of peace.

- ♦ **COMMUNION:** Fr. Chris will distribute the Body of Christ—he will move to the different sections and the faithful will be instructed by the usher; maintaining social distancing in the communion line. Fr. Chris will wear a face covering during distribution of Holy Communion.

***The faithful are strongly encouraged
to receive Communion in the hand.***

After receiving the Host, you will step to the “triangle” lower facemask & consume, then raise facemask and return to your seat.

- **Restrooms:** only one individual in restroom at a time (*parent accompanying their child is fine*).
- **END OF MASS:** When Mass ends, the faithful will be directed by ushers for dismissal, row by row, section by section. Everyone should immediately exit the building, no social gathering in the building, and go directly to your vehicles (*please — no social gathering in parking lot or other parish properties*)
- We are not allowed to have bulletins handed out; so our bulletin will continue to be typed Friday afternoon and posted to the webpage; printed copies will be at the front office foyer Monday thru Friday.
- Once everyone has exited, custodian will sanitize all surfaces (pews, doorknobs, railings, restrooms,) before we can have anyone enter for the next liturgy. So please exit as directed in order for the spaces to be cleaned.

The above information will be updated as we receive information from the Diocese and Governor.

Public Celebration of WEEKDAY Mass:

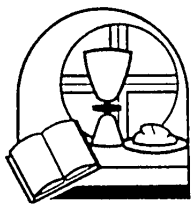
(Tuesday/Wednesday/Friday 8:30a & Thursday 6p)
