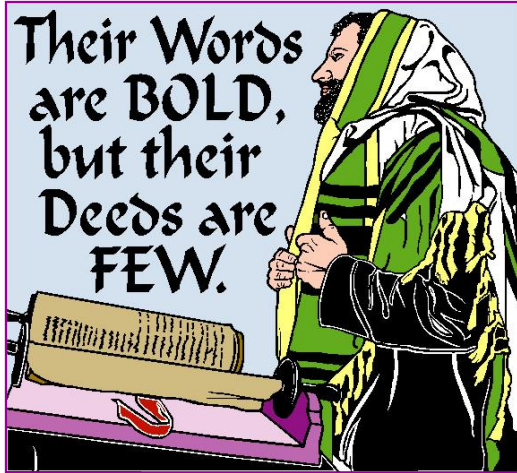

All Saints Day

On the Feast of All Saints we come together to honor all the holy people of God who have gone before us and allow their saintliness to be a model for our own lives. Those formally recognized as saints by the Church (canonized) have a day on the calendar to be recognized... because there are more souls in heaven than just those canonized, the Church sets aside Nov. 1st as the day we honor the memory of the unsung heroes of our faith. **ALL SAINTS DAY is a HOLY DAY of OBLIGATION for Catholics.** We will celebrate the *Holy Day Masses* here on: **Tuesday, November 1**
7:30 a.m., 12:15 p.m. and 7 p.m.

All Souls Day

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed is celebrated by the Church on Nov. 2. this feast is based on the doctrine that if the soul of the departed, upon leaving the body, is not cleaned of sin, then it cannot share in the glory of the Risen Christ. However, there is hope! The faithful on earth can help save a soul by offering prayers, good deeds and by attending the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. On All Souls Day we exercise the special charity of praying for the repose of the souls in purgatory. Our Masses for All Souls Day are: **Wednesday, November 2**
12:15 p.m. (in the cemetery/weather permitting)
7:00 p.m. (at this 7pm Mass we pray for all those from St. Anne's this past year.)

WELCOMING the Roman Missal III

The new translation of the Roman Missal will go into effect on the First Sunday of Advent. This week we continue in our preparation to welcome the new translation with some words about the Sanctus "Holy, Holy" (We've already begun singing the new translation of the Sanctus!)

The Sanctus ("Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts...")

The opening line is taken not from a hymnal, but from the angels' worship of God in heaven. In the Old Testament, the prophet Isaiah was given a vision of the angels praising God, crying out, "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts" (see Isaiah 6:3). The word "hosts" here refers to the heavenly army of angels. When we recite "Holy, Holy, Holy Lord" in the Mass, we are joining the angels in heaven, echoing their very words of worship. The previous translation of this prayer referred to the Lord as "God of power and might". In the new translation, we address Him as "**Lord God of hosts**". This more clearly echoes the biblical language of the angels in Isaiah and underscores the infinite breadth of God's power. All things in heaven and on earth are under His dominion — including the angels, who adore Him unceasingly. Indeed, He is "the Lord God of hosts."
